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The February State Budget Package



Magnitude of the Problem

- \$40 billion is over 40 percent of the General Fund Budget.
- Coming on the heels of an exceptionally difficult year.
- 2009-10 budget passed in February of this year—the earliest ever.



The Budget Solution

(In Billions)

Revenue Increases	1.5	11.0	12.5
Federal Fund Offset	2.8	5.7	8.5
Borrowing	0.3	5.1	5.4

Impact on Counties

Fairly minor.

- Criminal justice local assistance programs maintained through VLF rate increase.
- Some "trigger"-related impacts.
- Some cash pressures.



LAO March Update



Updated Economic, Revenue, and Spending Forecast

- February budget package based on economic assumptions from December.
- Economic picture continued to worsen.



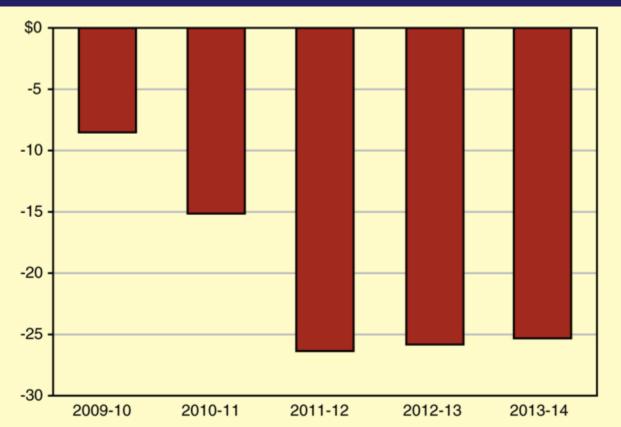
LAO Revenues

- We forecast a 2009-10 revenue decline of roughly \$8 billion.
- The defeat of Propositions added another \$6 billion to problem.
- Total budget problem of \$14 billion.

Additional "Problem"

Governor grew problem by \$3 billion.

- Now a total of \$24 billion.
- Also dropped RAW proposal (\$5.5 billion).
- Combined, administration needs almost \$9 billion in new solutions.



New Solutions— RAW Replacements

- Eliminate CalWORKs.
- Eliminate Healthy Families.
- Reduce Mental Health Managed Care.
- Variety of other Health and Human Services proposals.

Potential Impacts on Counties

- Major increase in general assistance.
- Major impacts on health safety net.
- Significant impacts on sheriffs/probation departments.



LAO Assessment



Our Problem Definition Similar to the Administration's

- \$3 billion in lower revenues.
- Serious concerns about the RAW.
- Major out-year problems.



LAO Options Affecting Counties

- Loan of gas tax subvention (\$500 million).
- Proposition 42 suspension.
- VLF local assistance funding (\$250 million).
- Various other health and human services options.



Softening the Blow— Mitigation and Flexibility

- Prop 1A Suspension.
 - Different allocation, hardship provision.
- Loan of gas tax monies.
 - Use Proposition 1B monies (\$700 million).
- Eliminate mandates.
- Other?



Needed Action

- Act quickly to bring budget back into balance.
 - Cash concerns remain pressing.
- Spend the rest of session preparing for 2010-11 and future years.
 - Turn to longer-run reform efforts.
