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Governor. No proposal.

Senate. No proposal.

Assembly. Provided one-time cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) for California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) cash grants beginning January 2016.

- 2015-16 Cost. \$46 million General Fund for a half-year of implementation.
- Ongoing Cost. The cost of the COLA would roughly double to around \$95 million in 2016-17 and ongoing, reflecting a full year of implementation.

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Statutory Annual CalWORKs COLA Eliminated in 2009. Historically, CalWORKs grants were subject to an annual COLA pursuant to state law (although this COLA was suspended in many years through the annual budget process). As part of the 2009-10 budget package, this statutory annual COLA was eliminated on an ongoing basis.

CalWORKs Grants Remain Below Pre-Recession Levels. In 2007-08, a family of three with no other income received a CalWORKs grant of \$723 per month. Since that time, CalWORKs grants have been both reduced and increased. Specifically, grants were reduced by 4 percent in 2009 and by 8 percent in 2011. Grants were later increased by 5 percent in 2014 and again by 5 percent in April 2015. Under both Assembly and Senate proposals, the nominal CalWORKs grant would remain slightly lower than in 2007-08, prior to the recession.

Current Law Provides for "Automatic" Grant Increases as Dedicated Funds Are Available.

As part of the 2013-14 budget package, a portion of realignment growth funds dedicated to local administration of health and social services programs was redirected to pay for the costs of future CalWORKs grant increases. Under a process described in state law, CalWORKs grants are increased by an amount commensurate with available funds, after the ongoing costs of all previous grant increases have been paid. In 2015-16, the cost of two recent grant increases exceed available funds, meaning that no automatic increase will be provided. However, we estimate that dedicated funds may be sufficient to provide a small automatic grant increase as early as 2016-17.
