

## Agenda Pages 8 and 9—Item 6110-134-0890— Federal School Improvement Funding

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### **Background**

- Under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, schools and districts must meet annual performance targets towards the goal of all students reaching proficiency by 2014.
- Title I schools and districts that fail to meet annual federal performance targets for two consecutive years enter "Program Improvement (PI)."
- Schools and districts that fail to meet performance targets after being in PI for two years are subject to federal sanctions/ "corrective action."
  - Schools are subject to one of five sanctions, including replacing staff, implementing a new curriculum, and appointing an external expert to advise the school.
  - Districts are subject to one of six sanctions, including replacing school district personnel, instituting a new curriculum, and appointing a trustee in place of the superintendent.
- Schools that fail to improve after entering corrective action are required to "restructure." Schools have five restructuring options, including replacing most school staff, reopening the school as a charter, and turning operation over the state.



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#### **Almost \$600 Million in Federal Funding Available**



A total of \$596 million in federal funds is available to California in 2009-10 for school improvement.

- \$127 million is "regular" ongoing federal funding for school improvement activities.
- \$391 million is one-time stimulus funding—\$346 million School Improvement Grant (SIG) funding and \$45 million Title I set-aside funding.
- \$78 million is carryover funding.

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#### **LAO Recommendations**

Use as much federal funding as possible to support Quality Education Investment Act /PI schools in 2009-10. Achieve \$282 million in state General Fund savings.

Cover base program costs.

Save remainder (\$286 million) to achieve future state savings.
