### Major K-12 Education Actions (Not in Conference)

June 2, 2004 Page 1



#### Both houses:

- Spent \$2 billion less than the Proposition 98 minimum guarantee for 2004-05 (although, technically, neither house has voted to suspend the minimum guarantee).
- Delayed Proposition 98 "settle-up" obligations for 2002-03 and 2003-04 (\$935 million).
- Provided full growth and cost-of-living adjustments (COLAs) plus several program augmentations.
- Rejected the Governor's proposed child care reforms, restoring reductions with \$120 million Proposition 98 funds.

- Most of the major changes beyond growth and COLA are in conference.
- Both houses took advantage of \$141 million in savings for K-12 schools Public Employees' Retirement System costs to make augmentations beyond the Governor's funding level.
- Both houses provide augmentations above the *2003-04 Budget Act* level for instructional materials, deferred maintenance, and school library materials.
- The two houses reduce the amount of funding deferred from 2003-04 to 2004-05 by differing amounts. These funds start to reduce the \$3.8 billion education credit card balance.
